



For over 40 years, he taught horsemanship skills through 4-H, competitive showing, and trail rides. He also served as a leader in the Boy Scouts of America, where he taught the leatherworking merit badge. Whatever Bill took on, he gave it his all—whether that meant helping with his wife's many volunteer projects, painting soccer lines, picking up donkeys, building exhibit display boards, or designing sets and props.

Debbie is a lifelong creative spirit. For over 30 years, she has designed costumes for community theater, high school productions, the Literary Arts Club, and the Cedar City Library. She has coached youth in soccer, baseball, softball, basketball, and 4-H. In Scouting, Debbie received the District Award of Merit and was honored as an Influential Woman in Scouting for her many years of service. She has sung in the community choir, volunteered with the high school band, and overseen exhibits and ticketing for the Iron County Fair. Her work at Parowan High School included roles as a custodian, classroom aide,

ticket taker, drama competition auditor, lunch duty supervisor, and scorekeeper.

Across the nation, purple and the purple ribbon has been adopted to show support for victims and for advocates to honor those who have lost their lives at the hands of someone they once loved. On Purple Night all rodeo participants, fans and support personnel are encouraged to wear purple to show their support for this great cause.

Domestic Violence (also known as intimate partner violence) includes physical violence, sexual violence, stalking, and psychological aggression (including coercive tactics) by a current or former intimate partner (i.e. spouse, boyfriend/girlfriend, dating partner, or ongoing sexual partner). Some forms of intimate partner violence (sexual violence, psychological aggression, coercive tactics, and stalking) can be perpetrated electronically through mobile devices and social media sites, as well as, in person. A child's exposure to domestic abuse is the strongest risk factor for transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next.

Breakaway roping is an exciting and fast-paced event in the world of rodeo. It's a timed competition where

a cowgirl on horseback chases a calf and ropes it as quickly as possible. The goal is to throw a loop around the calf's neck and then let the rope "break away" from the saddle horn, which stops the clock.

This event is all about speed and precision. It's a true display of the talent and athleticism of both the rider and the horse.



BARREL RACING

Barrel racing is one of the most exhilarating events in rodeo. It showcases the incredible partnership between

a rider and their horse as they navigate a cloverleaf pattern around three barrels in the fastest time possible.

Precision and speed are crucial, as knocking over a barrel results in a time penalty. Barrel racing is a true test of agility, speed, and teamwork.



RANCH HAND SADDLE BRONC

Ranch hand saddle bronc is a rodeo event that combines the rugged skills of ranch work with the thrill of bronc riding. In this event, riders use a working saddle, just like the ones used on the ranch, to ride a bucking horse for eight seconds.

Unlike traditional saddle bronc riding, the ranch hand version emphasizes the practical skills used in

everyday ranching, adding an authentic touch to the competition.
