# You can still get a Christmas Tree for \$10

If you have read some of my earlier articles, maybe you've started picking your own pumpkins and corn, so today I'm trying to sell you on the idea of cutting your own Christmas tree here in our local mountains courtesy of the Forestry Service. This involves a little more effort, but for the last two years we have driven up into Dixie National Forest and it was a ton of fun in spite of the wet socks and shoes.

### **Rules & Regulations**

For many years the rangers have offered you the chance to get muddy, wet and cold and bring home your own tree, fresh from the forest. BUT, you do need to get a permit that comes with a map and a list of rules and regulations from the Forest Service at their office at 820 N. Main Street, in Cedar City or online at recreation.gov. The permit does come with some rules, but the results are fun and you end up with a fresh tree for much less than you will find at a store.

One of the rules you need to be mindful of is that all tree cutting must be a minimum of 100 ft.

from the road which will require a short hike back into the forest to find that perfect tree. You are not allowed to just cut off just the top part of a tall tree, and leave the rest of the stump in the ground. Please cut down the entire tree and groom it later. Over the years, some areas have been cut to the point where trees are no longer easily accessible and you may have to hike back considerably more than 100 ft. Our rangers work hard to maintain a healthy forest and in return for their \$10 trees, please don't leave your tree trimmings behind on the forest floor.

This year, why not consider heading up to the mountains with a couple of friends and neighbors and making it a family fun day. It's a good idea to check the weather when you plan an outing, if it's snowing, you may be at risk of a frozen family! There are many unnamed fire roads just off Highway 14, where you can park your car off the busy highway, but if we do get a big snowfall it's nearly impossible to access most of these fire roads without a snowmobile. I would highly suggest that you plan your trip sooner rather than later, the trees will stay very fresh, even a month before Christmas. All of the trees you will soon see for sale in the stores were probably cut in October, and not kept in water, so if you cut your tree early, before the snow

mounts up, it will most likely stay fresh into the New Year. So, for \$10 your permit will allow you to cut up to a 10-foot tree, and for \$20, you can get a tree up to 20 feet. Be aware there is a \$2.50 service charge per tree.

Bring along a cold weather picnic and some hot chocolate or your favorite hot toddy to enjoy on your tailgate after your holiday lumberjacking. We've had a blast doing this along with friends over the last couple of years, and here's a little advice:

- Bring a tarp or some pieces of cardboard so you can kneel to cut the tree close to the ground without getting too wet.
- A chain saw is better than a hand saw, and easier than an axe.
- Bring enough rope to tie the tree down safely.
- A two-wheel-drive car will definitely limit you as to which roads you can explore for trees.
- Try to cut your tree before the snow piles up too high to walk around,
   4 inches of snow is much easier than 4 feet.
- Some extra socks and gloves would be smart.
- Make sure you get a photo of yourselves which you can enjoy later and marvel at your accomplishment.

Enjoy all the upcoming holidays, and, as Christmas gets closer you can relax in your living room with a warm fire and forget about the wet clothes and cold feet from the day you cut that perfect tree!


Santa Claus is the magic of Christmas. He brings us happiness and good cheer. The joy of giving and family are the true gifts that Santa brings.

# Cedar City's Holiday Tree Jubilee Turns Festive Fun into Community Support

As winter approaches Cedar City, a special kind of magic begins to take shape inside the Heritage Theater. Beautifully decorated trees, the sparkle of lights, and the warmth of community spirit all come together for one of the city's most beloved traditions—the Holiday Tree Jubilee, returning November 29 and December 1-2!

Now marking its eighth year in Cedar City, the Holiday Tree Jubilee began as a dream of founder Laura Albrecht, who wanted to bring people together and spread holiday cheer to those who needed it most. She had heard of tree jubilees in other communities and saw the potential to create something meaningful right here in Cedar City.

"I wanted to create something joyful that could also make a real difference," Albrecht said. "Every year, this event goes beyond what I imagined, and it's incredible to see how it continues to grow and bring joy to more people."

With the help of hundreds of generous sponsors and volunteers, Albrecht and her team bring the magic of the holidays to life inside the Heritage Theater. The space is transformed into a cozy winter wonderland filled with the aroma of hot cocoa, cheerful gift baskets, handmade quilts, and more than 60 beautifully decorated Christmas trees.

This year's Holiday Tree Jubilee will showcase a mix of creative and classic designs — from Nike, K-Pop Demon Hunters, and Citrus Garden Party—themed trees to timeless favorites featuring gingerbread men, vintage holiday décor, and nutcrackers.

The Jubilee has partnered with the City's Downtown Lighting event which draws thousands of people to Cedar City's Main Street.

Unlike many similar events, the Holiday Tree Jubilee adds a fun twist to giving back. Instead of bidding on trees, visitors can buy tickets and place them in front of the trees they'd love to take home—the more tickets, the better the chances to win!

"It's so fun knowing that one ticket could be all it takes to win a tree," said Jeri Oveson, who serves on the Holiday Tree Jubilee Board. "That's what makes this event so special—everyone gets a fair chance."

A select few of the most elaborate trees will be part of an auction for those eager to guarantee their favorite. Every tree is sponsored and decorated by local families and businesses, with many longtime supporters returning each season to share in the holiday spirit.

"The Holiday Tree Jubilee is one of my favorite traditions," said Danica Bulloch, who is putting together a tree this year on behalf of Bulloch Construction. "Decorating a tree is fun, but knowing it helps support local children makes it truly special," she said.

The impact of the Jubilee reaches far beyond the decorated trees. Every dollar raised goes to local causes such as Shop With a Cop, Iron County Care and Share, and to helping homeless or disadvantaged students in the Iron County School District. Thanks to the community's donations, last year's event raised tens of thousands of dollars for those in need.

"The Cedar City Police Department is thankful for the many years of partnership with the Holiday Tree Jubilee and for their generosity," said Justin Ludlow, Public Affairs Sergeant. "Through programs like Shop With a Cop, we're able to positively impact families throughout Iron County and bring smiles to the faces of children each holiday season - we truly couldn't do it without these funds."


This year's Holiday Tree Jubilee will be held November 29 from 3-8 p.m. and



# 20th Annual Holiday Light Display raises money for Charity

Ben Hohman and Marielle Boneau, and their many elves, will once again be doing their holiday light display at 26 North 1150 West in Cedar City, near the SUU football stadium. This will be the 20th year of the display. As part of the display donations are collected for Make-A-Wish <sup>®</sup> Utah. The Display has raised over \$35,000 for Make-A-Wish <sup>®</sup> Utah in the 19 years it has been running. They also donate the value of their December power bill to the organization. The display lights up each evening from five thirty to ten p.m. weather permitting starting on December second and running through December 31st, weather permitting.




